


COMMUNITY SAFETY SNAPSHOT



Community safety comes from a combination of behaviours, circumstances and environmental factors that impact on a community's safety and wellbeing.

Promoting community safety requires coordination and partnerships with a wide range of government services, agencies and the community. When people feel safe within their communities, they are more likely to get involved in community life and participate in their local neighbourhood, which is critical to increase mental and physical wellbeing.

This rate has remained steady over the past 6 years.




