OVERALL RECOMMENDATIONS CARLTON NORTH/PRINCES HILL 3054

- · Curtain Square and Hardy Gallagher Reserve provide good distribution of Neighbourhood parks. The wide grassed central medians to some local streets and Park Street linear reserve provide reasonable access to Local open space for residents in this precinct.
- · It is unlikely there will be substantial change to the existing residential population in this Precinct, according to current strategic planning prepared by DSE and Council for this area.
- Improve the use of Hardy Gallagher Reserve to meet community needs
- Improve walking and cycling links between open space as highlighted on the plan and in accordance with other council strategies including Yarra Street Planting Precinct Masterplans.

SUB-PRECINCT 3054A

- · Hardy Gallagher Reserve appears to be underutilised and has potential to improve its role as a Neighbourhood park. Recommend preparation of a Conservation Plan followed by a Masterplan in consultation with the community to improve its use.
- · The wide grassed central medians including Pigdon Street are used as passive Local open space. Ensure future management retains this passive use, as these are the only local open space reserves in the
- Regularly liaise with the City of Melbourne regarding future provision of facilities in Princes Park for Yarra's residents, and potential complementary use of Hardy Gallagher Reserve by City of Melbourne residents

SUB-PRECINCT 3054B

- · Curtain Square is the main area of open space in this sub-precinct and functions as a successful and popular Neighbourhood park. Future upgrade, facilities and maintenance levels are to be consistent with retaining and improving its popularity and use as a neighbourhood reserve and protecting its heritage conservation values as outlined in the existing Conservation Plan.
- Prepare a Conservation Plan followed by a Landscape Concept Plan for Park Street Reserve in consultation with the local community.
- Improve Curtain Street streetscape as an open space link to Edinburgh
- The dominant local open space areas within the sub-precinct are central medians of Canning Street, Drummond Street and the northern end of Rathdowne Street. Ensure passive recreational access to these is retained in future streetscape design works as recommended in the Yarra Street Planting Precinct Masterplans
